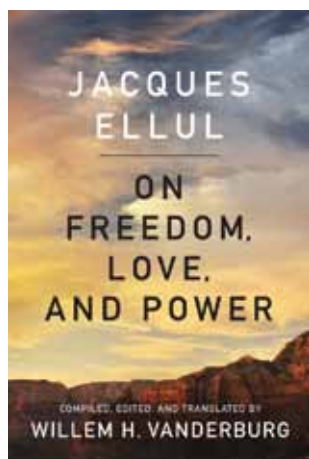

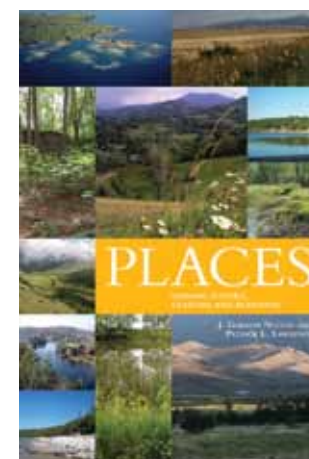


On Freedom, Love, and Power

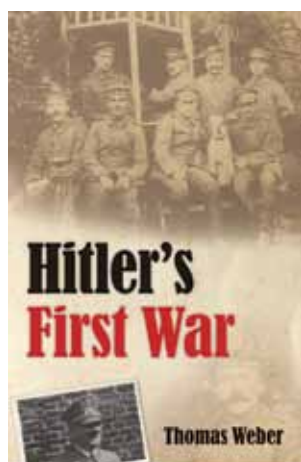
